It became the sixteenth chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority in the state of New Jersey. The chapter presented itself to the Morristown community on July 26, 1987 at the Frelinghuysen Arboretum in Morris Township, New Jersey.

Since its humble beginning, **Morristown Alumnae Chapter** has grown abundantly as the chapter experienced significant increase with the induction of sixteen dynamic ladies in 1994. To date, six more groups of impressive and dynamic women have since been inducted into the chapter.
