The exhibit features historical photographs of African American women of Morristown. There will also be presentations of African American women educators who broke the barriers of racism and sexism to make major strides in the Morris School District.

The celebration of the exhibit will begin on Thursday, May 9 at 7 p.m., in The Gallery of the Morristown Library and will feature speakers and art presentations. On Wednesday, May 29, the exhibit will conclude with a viewing of the short film, “Quiet Denial”. In the film, an African-American woman answers the question, “What is your race?”, while auditioning to study classical piano with a world-renowned concert pianist. A workshop will follow the viewing.
